MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

A People First Approach



I started a presentation recently saying, "I've never seen a business walk into a coffee shop, a brewery, ride on a trail, or enjoy a concert in a park. People do those things. People start businesses. People invest in and enjoy their communities."

That seems like a basic point, but too often we economic developers overlook it. Our narrative is focused

on jobs, businesses, and industry sector trends as if it's all driven by faceless AI, data dumps and market access needs alone. That may have worked in the past, but not now.

Big cities and small towns alike are adopting development strategies that put people first. It's an approach that recognizes when people love where they live and work, they will stay, invest, and become advocates for their communities. They will help to attract more people, who will invest, and create more businesses.

While human-centric development strategies have been around for a while, their relevancy and impact are growing as a more mobile workforce, amplified by the pandemic, is bringing more flexible earning options for people. People are raising their anchors from traditional employment centers, choosing where they want to live and work rather than where they must.

And when that happens, this happens: Area Development Magazine's national survey of business leaders revealed that "Quality of life" landed the #2 priority spot in their 2023 rankings — a jump from 11th place the previous year. Talent availability was #1.

The magazine reported that "as workers took stock of their lives during the pandemic, they placed greater emphasis on work/life balance, resigning from unfulfilling jobs or opting to continue working remotely, demanding greater flexibility in schedules. Quality of life thereby gained in importance among the site selection factors corporate executives consider when planning their expansion or location moves."

This is a big move and is why ABCD Corporation and the Chamber of Commerce are doubling down on our place-based strategies and messaging. Our trails, parks, and all active outdoor assets are of equal importance to our roads, water, and broadband infrastructure.

It's all about attracting people. To do that well we need to continue with a people first approach, turning visitors into permanent residents, investors, a talented workforce, and advocates for our First Frontier Blair County community.

CURRY INNOVATION CENTER

Curry Companies completed the renovation of a historic retail complex into the Curry Innovation Center housing their corporate offices and the newly established St. Francis University Chemistry and Engineering advanced degree programs. ABCD Corp. partnered with Curry Companies on the \$4 million purchase and renovation project.

GRAYSTONE CASA BELLA

Groundbreaking officially commenced on the Graystone Casa Bella project which represents a \$35.5 million investment. The new construction will include 190 luxury units for residents 55+, a 220 car parking structure, indoor/outdoor rooftop fitness center with pickleball courts and a halfcourt basketball court.





LEVITY BREWING CO. ALTOONA

Levity Brewing opened its 2,400 sq/ft taproom, kitchen and brewery in a historic building that first opened in 1921. The space has been repurposed into seating for 150 people, 24 taps and a 5-barrel brewhouse. ABCD worked closely with the building owners and Levity partners to bring this unique experience to Downtown Altoona.

BLAIR COUNTY ENTERPRISE ZONE

ABCD Corp. worked with the PA Dept. of Community and Economic Development to create one of the largest concentrations of Enterprise Zones (EZ) in the state. ABCD extended their existing EZ's in the City of Altoona and Logan Township and added new zones in the boroughs of Hollidaysburg, Roaring Spring, Tyrone, and Williamsburg.



2022 HIGHLIGHTS



COFFEE ON 3RD

Coffee on 3rd is the borough of Duncansville's first gourmet coffee shop and represents a renovation and repurposing of a former car garage. The business' owner is a third generation entrepreneur on 3rd Avenue in Duncansville and ABCD Corp. was proud to assist in the financing for the purchase and renovation.

ROCKLAND MANUFACTURING - CLAYSBURG

Rockland Manufacturing purchased the 44 acre former Harbison Walker International site in Claysburg to grow their company headquartered in Bedford county, PA. Rockland will utilize and upgrade the rail service to the site as well as renovating some of the existing structures. Rockland offers over 200 products and produces products for OEMs and construction machinery dealers globally.





THE COLUMNS BANQUET CENTER

The Columns Banquet Center in Downtown Altoona completed their comprehensive restoration project and re-opened the historic building for events and office rental space. Skillful craftsmanship by the building owners preserved the architectural and artistic details as they would have been when the building opened in 1924. ABCD Corp. secured Enterprise Zone Tax Credits for the project.

ABCD CORP. ALLOCATED \$4 MILLION IN SSBCI FUNDING

ABCD Corp. was allocated \$4 million through the State Small Business Credit Initiative (SSBCI) to support small businesses. ABCD Corp. was awarded a \$2 million allocation in 2012 under the first round of SSBCI funding. That program was overwhelmingly successful, resulting in private investment match of over \$50 million, the creation of 130 jobs and the retention of another 247 jobs.





ALTOONA INVESTMENT FUND

The Altoona Investment Fund was established through a partnership with the City of Altoona and ABCD Corp. A \$4 million ARPA allocation seeded a revolving loan fund for projects located within the city boundaries. To date, 16 projects have been approved resulting in over \$9 million in private match.


